2010-2011 Graduate and Predoctoral Fellowship Program in Ethnic Studies Application Form

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The Institute of American Cultures (IAC) is responsible for strengthening and coordinating interdisciplinary research and instruction in ethnic studies with special attention to the four UCLA Ethnic Studies Research Centers: American Indian Studies Center, Asian American Studies Center, Bunche Center for African American Studies, and Chicano Studies Research Center.

The IAC, in cooperation with the Ethnic Studies Research Centers, offers graduate fellowships to UCLA students with a demonstrated interest in African American, American Indian, Asian American, or Chicana/o studies. The fellowships are awarded to those individuals who, in the judgment of the IAC Executive Committee, show great promise in academic research and scholarship in ethnic studies.

ELIGIBILITY

This campuswide program is open only to graduate students at UCLA and seeks to support students in the completion of their thesis/dissertation. *Application for the fellowship in African American Studies is open only to doctoral students who will have advanced to candidacy by the beginning of the fellowship year.*

FUNDING

The fellowship consists of a stipend in the maximum amount of \$18,500 plus all in-state fees. Restrictions apply regarding acceptance of supplemental employment and/or other awards during the fellowship year. Contact the IAC Office for further information.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The fellowship review committee is comprised of UCLA researchers from a diverse range of disciplines.

Only **complete** applications will be considered. The following components are required for a complete application:

1. Statement of Purpose

Give careful consideration to the statement of purpose. Present your academic and career objectives, as well as any distinctions that could augment your research. Explain and support why your research should be considered meritorious to the appropriate Ethnic Studies Research Center. Address the following in your statement. Limit: 2 pages single-spaced.

- What are your primary academic goals and research interests?
- How do you see your participation in this fellowship program as developing these goals and interests? Clarify any specific impact on teaching and/or scholarly research in ethnic studies.
- How will participation in this fellowship program contribute to your academic, professional and personal development?

2. Research Summary

Summarize the research project you have selected for your thesis/dissertation. State your investigative approach to the problem, theoretical background, methodology, and analysis plan. Limit: 2 pages single-spaced (12 pt font, 1 inch margins).

NOTIFICATION OF AWARDS

Applicants will be notified of award decisions in mid-March (Bunche, CSRC) or after May 31 (AASC, AISC).

3. Transcripts

All applicants must submit official transcripts for all college-level courses taken in degree-granting programs. Request transcripts well in advance of the deadline.

4. Supporting Documents

- Secure letters of recommendation from **three** faculty members with whom you have worked most closely. Use the enclosed Appraisal Forms and provide references with a copy of your proposal. Have your letters of recommendation sent directly to the appropriate Ethnic Studies Research Center. **Note the "received by" deadline.** Applications without all the primary and supplemental materials by the deadline will **not** be reviewed.

Under Federal law entitled the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, students are given the right to inspect their records, including letters of recommendation. We shall consider all letters of recommendation carefully. We believe, however, that in many instances letters written in confidence are of greater utility in the long run as a means of assessing a student's qualifications, abilities, and promise. You have the option of agreeing or not agreeing to waive your right to inspect these letters.

- Curriculum vitae.
- Thesis/Dissertation proposal.

- Submit **ONE ORIGINAL AND EIGHT (8) COLLATED COPIES** of all materials except those not coming directly from the applicant.
